NEWS FROM THE TOP

It was my pleasure to return once again as the Primary Summit Steward on the summit of Mount Arab.

As usual I commenced on Mother's Day and finished the season on Columbus Day, working three to four days a week and hosting large crowds of hikers.

At the summit museum I displayed extensive educational materials including maps, posters and paintings of local wildlife as well as merchandise that may be found on sale in a large display case at Fortunes True Value Hardware Store in Tupper Lake, NY.

Our climbers experienced a relatively wet Adirondack summer escaping the drier conditions in Upstate New York. My extensive knowledge of local Natural History, Human History, and Geology was useful as many climbers had a great many thoughtful questions.

Our new observation benches honoring family members, and wildlife paintings by our "artist at large: Roger Hall (www.inkart.net) were constantly complimented.

Our trail continues to be litter free and in great condition with minimal human impact. A small rerouting of the upper trail is planned for 2023 to avoid a steep bedrock slope that can be slippery when wet.

My tried and true Hummingbird Ecology Program continued with great success and increased to include other avian species enjoying both black oil sunflower seeds and the less well known, but highly nutritious, nyjer seeds from my bird feeders.

I hope to return again for a thirteenth year to staff the summit for the Friends of Mount Arab at this most rewarding of jobs. I hope to see many of you at the top.

I had the privilege of returning as a summit steward this season to help care for one of our region's greatest resources. Since my family has owned property on one of the lakes within the Mount Arab community for 55 years, I've been hiking the mountain my entire life. Rain or shine, we are blessed with an amazing resource: arguably one of the most family-friendly summit hikes in all the Adirondacks. FOMA's work to care for the tower and observer's cabin really shows.

I began hiking the trail up Mount Arab long before FOMA was formed. So I know what the trail and summit looked like before FOMA, and I know what it looks like now. There has been a dramatic improvement in the trail, tower, and cabin with far less littering and destruction of the environment. When people see that something is well-cared for, they tend to be more careful and respectful in turn. Good stewardship begets good stewardship. We need FOMA to keep doing this important work, and the contributions from our supporters help to make it all possible.

The work we are doing is accomplishing so much more than just helping to maintain one mountain; Mount Arab has become a priceless educational resource and economic catalyst for our region. When we contribute to advancing this important work on our mountain, we are advancing the Adirondacks as a whole. Our work on Mount Arab is well worth it, and I look forward to many years of helping to preserve this amazing resource.

Summit Museum

Our summit museum is an important repository for the history of our fire tower. We are seeking components of an authentic Fire Observer uniform, hoping to create a new museum display. Anyone who has such items and would like to donate is encouraged to contact FOMA.

Tower Work

The Horizon Displays above the windows in the tower have been falling into disrepair, helped along by vandals who used spray paint to damage part of them. Further damage has resulted from seasonal expansion and contraction that has cracked the protective plexi covering.

The Displays have been temporarily removed and stored away. While doing this, a patch has been affixed over a cracked portion of the tower roof and some new bolts installed.

We have a tentative plan for remounting the Horizon Displays using aluminum, and a plan for installing protective plexi coverings that will not subject these coverings to stresses that would crack them.

Plans for 2023

We plan to remount the tower Horizon Displays in the coming year and replace the badly cracked plexi on one of the tower windows.

HISTORY of the FRIENDS of MOUNT ARAB (FOMA)

With the common desire to save and to share this historical facility and its magnificent views with future generations, they resolved to restore and maintain the sadly decaying fire tower and fire observer's cabin located there.
