On that note... water bars are diagonal rockworks designed to divert water off the downhill side of the trail. Dips are shallow bowls designed to accomplish the same goal. We all know trails can develop muddy spots. Skirting the muddy spots causes erosion and the loss of soil-preserving plant and tree roots. Horizon displays replaced

Earlier this year with the very able help of Board member Zach Hoyt, I really should say 'essential help' because it took his long arms out the window to hold the bolts through the roof; we finally re-mounted the horizon displays on aluminum frames over the windows in the tower cab. They had been taken down because the original wood backing was starting to fail.

2023 Tahawus Trail Crew work

The Tahawus Trails crew, contracted by DEC to work on state trail projects, has removed the old wood stairway half way up the mountain, and has constructed a new wood stairway to traverse the exposed bedrock on this portion of the Mount Arab trail. Great job by the trail crew.

Further up, the Trail Crew completed a trail re-route around another exposed bedrock portion of the Mount Arab trail.

FOMA trailhead sale

On August 27, 2023 FOMA Board members and volunteers conducted a 'pop-up' sale of FOMA merchandise and other items at the Mount Arab trailhead.

Window replacement scheduled for spring

Cracks have developed in 2 of the 8 tower cab windows. Replacement plexy has already been cut to size and transported to the summit - thanks Zach. The cracked windows are not about to fall out so should be good until spring when hopefully we shall be able to replace them. We believe that over tightened bolts that did not allow for differential expansion and contraction led to the cracking.

Wood stand for Map Table

A low wood display stand for the FOMA reconditioned Map Table, originally mounted on a pedestal in the tower cab, has been constructed and transported to the summit by Board member Zach Hoyt. The decision to mount the map table on a low frame easily viewed by our younger climbers and to be kept in the observer's cabin was made after the vandalism and theft of the map table mounted in the tower on Poke-O-Moonshine back in 2022.
