### **Colin Tuggle, Summit Steward**

Once again I have had the privilege of returning as a summit steward this season to help care for one of our region's greatest resources. Since my family has owned property on a lake within the Mount Arab community for 58 years, I've been hiking the mountain my entire life. Rain or shine, we are blessed with an amazing resource: arguably one of the most family-friendly summit hikes in the Adirondacks. The hikers I met this the summer confirmed that FOMA's work to care for the trail, tower, and observer's cabin is deeply appreciated!

I began hiking the trail up Mount Arab long before FOMA was formed so I know what the trail and summit looked like before. And, I know what it looks like now. There have been dramatic improvements in the trail, tower, and cabin with far less littering and destruction of the environment. When people see that something is well-cared for they tend to be more careful and respectful in turn. Good stewardship begets good stewardship. We need FOMA to keep doing this important work, and the contributions from our supporters help to make it all possible.

The work we are doing is accomplishing so much more than just helping to maintain one mountain. Mount Arab has become a priceless educational resource and economic catalyst for our region – visited by countless families, camps, and school groups. ### **Sheila Young, Summit Steward**

Stewarding on Mt Arab is the highlight of my summer season. I truly enjoy welcoming hundreds of hikers and inviting them to enter the cabin museum and to ascend the tower. The best part of communicating with visitors is that every one of us shares a goal of enjoying the forest, the trail, and the historic summit. I have also volunteered during the off months, climbing the mountain at least monthly to check the cabin, tower, and privy. I also lead ADK members on a winter ascent, put up additional trail marking disks, and organize and conduct the statewide 'Lighting of the Towers' event, this year on the night of August 30. I am looking forward to next year.

I recommend that all hikers carry the "10 Essentials" with them at all times. You never know when you will need these items or find someone else that needs your help.

1. Navigation tools and the skill to use them
2. Insulating clothing, rainwear and appropriate footwear
3. Light source - not just your cell phone!
4. 1st aid kit - even simple band-aids for blisters
5. Emergency kit - whistle, duct tape, zip ties, knife
6. Fire starting capability
7. Extra calories
8. Plenty of water
9. Sunscreen and insect repellent
10. Shelter - even a simple Mylar tarp

I am looking forward to next season.

The Parishville-Hopkinton School Administration had requested and received a Temporary Revocable Permit (TRP) from NYS DEC for this class hike up Mount Arab. All area schools and other organizations should be aware of this DEC requirement for hiking groups of more than 20 people. (Activities other than hiking have different requirements.) All groups planning to hike Mount Arab are encouraged to comply with this DEC requirement. FOMA, if possible, will try to make a steward available at the summit for groups with a TRP. This will make the Observer's cabin, our Museum, open for viewing.
